

## CRISS CROSS STITCH SCARF

<b>MATERIALS</b>	DK or light worsted yarn approx. 400 yards* Size 8 needles (I used circular) Two stitch markers**
<b>STITCHES</b>	Seed Stitch Row 1 k1, p1, k1, p1; repeat across Seed Stitch Row 2 p1, k1, p1, k1; repeat across  Criss Cross Row 1: sl1 as if to purl, k1, yo, lift slipped stitch over K and yo stitches Criss Cross Row 2: purl across
<b>GAUGE</b>	22 stitches = 4" in criss cross pattern
<b>DIMENSION</b>	62" x 8"
<b>PATTERN</b>	c/o 40 stitches. Knit 6 rows of seed stitch pattern. Keeping in seed stitch for the first four stitches, place marker, begin pattern across 32 stitches, place marker, seed stitch last 4 stitches. Keep in pattern for 60", <b>ending on row one</b> , seed stitch last six rows. Bind off. (I bound off in seed stitch)  Cut yarn, tie in both ends.

\* I used a yarn called Sable which is 70% merino wool, 30% French angora. This was yarn given to me years ago and I wanted to use it up. No weight was listed on the label, but it appears to be either a light worsted or DK weight. They are very close. It is extremely dense, and I mean dense. A different brand of worsted or DK yarn will drape much softer depending upon the contents. This scarf I made will definitely keep the wearer warm.

\*\* Using the stitch markers to denote where to begin and end the border seed stitches was very helpful.
